

3.0 Collaboration to Reform Media Law

3.1 MICAT and PUL agree and hereby undertake to continue to collaborate on efforts to comprehensively reform statutes that criminalize speech consistent with the expressed commitment of the Government of Liberia to improve the legal, political and economic environment for a free and flourishing media.

4.0 Entry into Force

4.1 This Memorandum shall, upon its execution by the duly authorized representatives of both parties, be deemed to have taken effect from October 22, 2014, and shall remain in force as long as necessary for the convenience of both parties.

5.0 Amendment of Terms, Management and Termination

5.1 This Memorandum does not create enforceable legal obligations or third party rights and any issues not mentioned in it may be resolved through mutual consent.


5.2 MICAT and the PUL agree to work collaboratively to determine the modalities for the implementation and execution of this agreement.

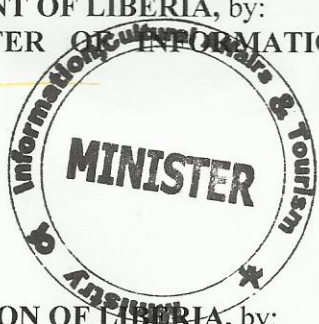
5.3 Upon the request of either party, this Memorandum may be amended or revised with the written agreement of both parties.

5.4 Notwithstanding the terms established under clause 1, this Memorandum may be terminated by either party upon the giving of three (3) months written notice.
